 - "I wanted to get far away so that I could spend my time in prayer, uninterrupted." - Treasures out of darkness, Pg. 89








That prayer is still moving throughout generations and the world!

- Hudson Taylor
 - The first missionary to Inland China
 - According to God's will PRAYERS
 - "We must move men through prayer" Hudson Taylor, 1866

 - Power of Prayer

- UNPARALYZED








The 4th "Movement Man" who moved in prayer

- David Livingstone
 - Doctor / Pioneer Missionary into Africa
 - "Only You can" prayers
 - "Send me anywhere, only go with me. Lay any burden on me, only sustain me. Sever any ties but the tie that binds me to Your service and to Your heart" - David Livingstone, 1840
 - Generations to come prayers
 - David Livingstone → Kneeling on what one day would become Zambian Land, Livingstone is said to have prayed, "Dear God, on this soil on which my knee bends, raise a mighty Christian nation that will be a light to other nations."







The 5th "Movement Woman" who moved in prayer

- Amy Carmichael
 - Was a Christian Missionary in India
 - My God can, but even if He doesn't, prayers
 - "My Father, quiet me, till in thy holy presence, hushed, I think thy thoughts with Thee" - Amy Carmichael



The 6th "Movement Man" who moved in prayer

- John Hyde
 - The Deaf Prayer Warrior Missionary to India 1892
 - Mountain Moving, prayers
 - "Oh God, give me souls or I die!" John Hyde
 - "Lord, give me Scotland or give me death!" John Knox, 1559

Vanquish: A Warriors ability to defeat its Rivals or Sworn Enemies

• George Mueller:

 The great prayer warrior said it well, when he said, "The great fault of the children of God is, they do not continue in prayer; they do not go on praying; they do not persevere!"

• E.M. Bounds:

 Praying is spiritual work; and human nature does not like taxing, spiritual work. Human nature wants to sail to heaven under a favoring breeze, a full, smooth sea. Prayer is humbling work. It abases intellect and pride, crucifies vainglory, and signs our spiritual bankruptcy, and all these are hard for flesh and blood to bear. It is easier not to pray than to bear them. So we come to one of the crying evils of these times, maybe of all times--little or no praying. Of these two evils, perhaps <u>little praying</u> is worse than <u>no praying</u>. Little praying is a kind of make-believe, a opiate for the conscience, a farce and a delusion.





- Charles Spurgeon says:
 - "Of course the preacher is above all others distinguished as a man of prayer. He prays as an ordinary Christian, else he were a hypocrite. He prays more than ordinary Christians, else he were disqualified for the office he has undertaken. If you as ministers are not very prayerful, you are to be pitied. If you become lax in sacred devotion, not only will you need to be pitied but your people also, and the day cometh in which you shall be ashamed and confounded."
